At least seven days' notice is required before the first reading of the banns

- 3 If either of you will not be 18 by the proposed date of the wedding, the priest will need to know whether the consent of the parents or guardians has been obtained.
- 4, 11, 12 The church's official rules do not permit the marriage in church of anyone who has been divorced from a husband or wife who is still alive. Anyone in this position should consult their parish priest.
- 6 Make sure you include the name of the town, county and postcode
- 15 This means that the Church of England parish in which you live. If either of you lives in a different parish from that in which the marriage is to take place, you will have to arrange for the banns to be read there too and obtain a banns certificate.
